Added Conditional Acceptance:

Please note: The minimum grade point average (GPA) and additional requirements for each program are noted below.

Students who do not meet the minimum GPA requirements of any graduate business program (excluding 4 + 1) as indicated below may be given consideration for admittance to the program desired if acceptable GMAT/GRE scores are also submitted.

Conditional acceptance to certain graduate business programs may be extended to domestic students who are at least 24 years of age, who have a 2.41–2.84 cumulative undergraduate grade point average, and who demonstrate significant evidence of professional success. Students granted conditional acceptance may take a maximum of two JWU graduate courses. If a grade of B or better is earned in

each course, the student will be granted full admission to that program. Students who do not earn a B or better grade in each course will be dismissed from the program and unable to apply to any JWU graduate program.

Effective April 8, 2016, information regarding Academic Societies on Page 92 of the catalog should be considered invalid.

Please note that the Master of Science in Criminal Justice program description should have indicated that the degree awarded will be an M.S. degree, not an MSCJ degree.
